

Pre-schematic Stage Ages 4-7

- This stage grows out of scribbling which is a purely kinesthetic activity.
- Now the child is trying to consciously create things that have a relationship to the world around them.
- The beginning of graphic communication in the form of symbols, it gives parents and teachers insight to what the child is thinking and how they see the world around them.





Schematic Stage Ages 7-9


- After much experimentation, a young child arrives at a definite concept of man and his environment.
- The "schema" is the concept at which the child has arrived and repeats over and over.
- This is very individualized for each child.






Dawning Realism (The Gang Age) Ages 9-12

- The most outstanding characteristic of this age is the child's discovery that he is a member of society – a society of his peers.
- The child exhibits increasing social independence from adults.
- This is the beginning of self-discovery and identity.
